## Week 7 with Jamie Dougherty

## Supplies

Wood panel or canvas I'm using a 10x10" canvas in the video Acrylic paint pencil Paint pen or PITT pen or paint for filing in your design. Palette knife or old gift card texture stencil

## Tips

I use the raw wood. It keeps the texture and integrity of the wood present.

Use fun colors. Try new combinations

Dry your paint completely before you transfer your image. This will make it easier for the pencil to transfer onto your canvas.

Also you want to make sure your paint is dry so that if you use pen, the paint won't ruin the tips of your pens.

- 1. Using two to three different paint colors, randomly spread the paint over the canvas in a color block manner. Allow the colors to blend a bit.
- 2. Using a stencil with a towel of wet wipe you can wipe away some of the paint while the paint is still wet. This will create a ghost like effect in the paint
- 3. Then completely dry the canvas
- 4. Using a drawn image or a printed image, cover the back of the image with pencil. We will be using this as a transfer. If you have transfer paper you can use that as well.
- 5. Now flip your image face up and tape it into place. Then sketch the image with heavy force to press the pencil onto the canvas
- 6. Now, once your image is transferred pull up your template.
- 7. Color in your image with pen or paint. You can outline the image to add more contrast.
- 8. For an added touch include a boarder or put your piece in a frame.
